2013 Program Award Book Winners

Leadership –

First Place: Missouri

Since Missouri is situated near the center of the United States and experiences all types of natural disasters, the state determined that they need to education their friends and neighbors. Disaster Planning was the name of their project. They taught them about emergency disaster kits, gave them lessons on emergency preparedness, and on completing a comprehensive home inventory.

Action –

First Place – Texas

Texas, even though it is a small state, took on a big problem – breast cancer, Breast cancer is one of the scariest things women (and men) might have to face. Texas wanted to see what they could do to educate people on the importance of early detection through mammograms and self-exams. With only half their 7 membership participating, they managed to distribute 400 Hearth Fire #8, 2000 Promise Cards, and 75 shower cards.

Second Place – Kansas

Kansas chose to show citizenship in action by making their communities a better place to live, to put a smile on faces of the less fortunate, and encourage people to vote. They set a goal of 50 pillow cases, which turned into 115, and 10 items each month for the community Health Ministries, which turned into 20, and 164 inspirational boxes for the VA, which turned into 286. They were 26 organizations and facilities that were invoiced in this program. They touched 129,061 people with this program.

Third Place – Colorado

Colorado chose to promote their program “Honor Our Heroes” throughout their state. Their objective was to honor and assist heroes, both military and non-military, on a community level. Each group determined how they would accomplish this – they included donations made to the Wyoming VA Medical Center on a non-holiday day, providing food for an opening a a new home to a young injured veteran and his family, encouraging members to wear red on the Friday of their state conference (red = Remember Everyone Deployed), and working on a Wall of Heroes to be displayed in various stores.

Education

First Place – Tennessee

A Tennessee club took up the issue of bullying in the elementary schools. They developed a brochure called SAFE (Steps to Avoid Fearful Encounters) and distributed them to the classrooms with a response sheet attached. They asked if the parents knew what the policy was at their school, and if they wanted anymore information. They also made a bulletin board in the public library, a display for the County Fair, and donated books on bullying to each school.

Second Place – Kansas

Kansas took the Essay and Artwork contest on Citizenship and expanded it – not only did they use the programs as designed in the schools, but they also gave lessons to community senior centers, high school history classed, church groups, and the Boy Scouts. They taught these groups about the election process (voting machines), history of the flag and the history of the National Anthem.

Third Place – North Dakota

With the CHARACTER COUNTS! Program being implemented in many North Dakota schools, North Dakota wanted to help. By volunteering to bring the National FCE pillar booklets and FCE Friends storybooks to the schools, they found that they were warming welcomed into the schools to supplement their programs with our fun and educational activities. They were able to work with the teachers at different grade levels by using the booklets and storybooks, and well as the stuffed animals.

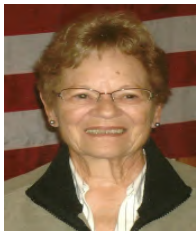
Valdimer Bairow

Missouri

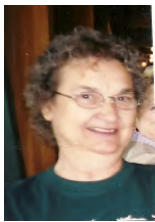
